### **The Pastor's Corner**

#### Having Time To Think

It seems to me that we are spending more and more time being entertained in some way. I think this first occurred to me in college living in a dormitory. One of my best friends lived down the hall. He plugged his record player (Remember those? If you are under forty, ask someone with grey hair about them.) into an outlet that was wired directly to the wall switch at the door so that instead of turning on a light when he entered his room he immediately turned on music. I would give him a

hard time about it as twenty year old male friends give each other a hard time about everything. His name was L.W. I would ask him, *L, what would happen if you had to spend five minutes alone with yourself without any audio or visual distractions?*

I wonder if such situations are more common now. People are either on the phone, texting, listening to music, watching television, gazing at a computer screen, or Blackberry, or iPhone, or video gaming, watching movies, twittering, or e-mailing. And it's wherever we go! — Driving in the car, trudging through the grocery store, sitting in the dentist chair. A while ago while walking in the woods I encountered a couple on the trail who in order to talk to me had to first remove their ear pieces which were connected to their Ipods. On a trail in the woods! On a hike! With birds singing and wind humming and brooks gurgling and sometimes just even quiet! The couple preferred instead to listen there to human made music! And I don't know that the most important issue in this is being oblivious to what is going on around us. I'm wondering more now what we might be missing that is going on inside us? What if we were alone with our own thoughts and guided them ourselves for a while? Don't we need to do that if we are going to take control of our lives?

I began thinking once more about all this while in Washington DC last month to officiate at my niece's wedding. She held the ceremony in the Reagan Building which is at 1300 Pennsylvania Avenue, so the family and wedding party stayed at the J.W. Marriot across the street. And, lo and behold, in the elevator going up to our rooms, at about eye level, on both sides of the door, were television screens tuned to CNN! Can you believe it!?

Now I know that people in Washington are very important people who need to stay up to date. Just ask them. But televisions in the elevator! How long is anyone ever in an elevator?! Debbie quipped that maybe the televisions were there in case the elevators got stuck. In the Washington DC J.W. Marriot, three blocks from the White House, people need not be alone with their thoughts even for the brief time they are in an elevator! Oh my.

If we are always being entertained by someone else or communicating with someone else, when will we think about our own lives— what's good about them and how blessed we are, what's wrong with them and how to improve them, the mistakes we made and how to correct them? And if we lose touch with ourselves can we ever get in touch with God? St. Paul thought it a good idea to, *Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. (1 Thessalonians 5:17)*

He also wrote, *Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there*

*is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. (Phillipians 4:8)*

We might suppose that he would also recommend that we first turn off all electronic devices.

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
